Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Polly and to my daughter Patsy
and to my son Josiah and to my daughter Nancy, and my son Charly
and my daughter Frank and to my son William Henry Neekols to
each of them all mentions twenty pounds a piece. My will and desire
that my estate should be kept together until my youngest son
becomes of age, then my will and desire is my estate should be
sold and equally divided betwix all of my children, I do desire the
estate as near as possible as to make them all equal as I well
can, have in a dear respect for all of my children -
lastly I appoint my son Thomas Neekols and

the one part and Benjamin Duball of Goochland county of the other part
Witnesseth that for the consideration of two hundred pounds in hand paid
before the sealing of these presents hath bargained & sold unto Benjamin
Duball one certain tract of land lying and being in Goochland county
containing one hundred & seventy three & $\frac{1}{4}$ acres being all the land I possess
in said county and bounded by the lines of Abram Fountaine, Charles
Comelius Larsons Dimue the three chopt road and Col. John Overton,
To have & to hold the above mentioned land with all appurtenances
their unto belonging and we John Turner and Sarah my wife
do warrant and will forever defend the title and title of the
above mentioned land with all the appurtenances their unto belonging,
to the said Benjamin Duball his heirs and assigns forever clear from
